As senior Past District Governor, Dr Parmar has been actively involved in our district having held many prestigious assignments. He has also been Rotary International President's representative in the annual RI District conferences at Bangalore (1996) RI District 3190, Colombo (2001) RI District 3220 and Baylarge RI District 3190 (2010-11).

Dr Parmar has been highly appreciated for promoting peace. He has served as the medical director and advisor to the surgical missions in India and other countries.

He has served the society not only through Rotary but also through various other organizations.

In his address in our meeting PDG Dr Parmar gave a very interesting presentation about 'Rotary Basics', which was very informative not only for the new Rotary members but senior members as well.

Dr Parmar explained that Rotary International is a volunteer organization of business and professional leaders united worldwide, who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help to build goodwill and peace in the world. There are more than 1.2 million members in 34,000 Rotary clubs, in more than 200 countries, comprising of 532 Rotary Districts.

Rotary – A Global Movement. founded on 23rd February 1905, the first four Members being Paul P Harris (Founder), Gus Loehr, Silvester Schiele and Hiram Shorey.

Rotary Motto is "Service Above Self";

- To develop fellowship amongst the people by coming together.
- Work together for community, at local, national and international levels for promoting world understanding and peace.

Dr Parmar also explained Rotary's Four-way test of the things we think, say or do.

- Is it the TRUTH?
- Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

The Four-Way Test was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor who served as RI President in 1954-1955.

Dr Parmar highlighted the object of Rotary is to encourage

and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular to encourage and foster the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service. High ethical standards in business and profession; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

The Avenue of Service was developed in the 1920s to clarify the object of Rotary. Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club. Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and practice high ethical standards. Community Service covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community. International Service encompasses actions taken to expand rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and promote world understanding and peace and Youth Services to work with young people to help them become the next generation of leaders, visionaries, and peacemakers.

Dr Parmar explained the Rotary Protocol and Decorum:

- 1. All meetings should be called to order by the President and not by the Master of Ceremonies.
- 2. Any Rotary meeting hosted by the district or a district committee should be presided over by the serving District Governor. He will call the meeting to order.
- 3. The protocol to be observed in order of precedence of Greetings is District Governor, Past District Governor (Seniority wise), DGE, DGN, District Officer, Serving Presidents, Past Presidents, Presidents Elect and so on.
- 4. If the Mayor or the First Citizen of the town is present in the meeting, he should be invited to the dias and should be recognized.
- 5. In any Rotary Meeting if the serving Governor is present, as the Chief Guest, he should speak last. After the speech of the governor there should be no further speeches. The only item after his speech should be acknowledgments and vote of thanks.
- 6. During the official visit of the Governor to the club, there should be no other chief Guest, Governor being the only one.
- 7. All club meetings, installation ceremonies, Governor's official visit etc. should be concluded, as far as possible within one hour.





8. Care should be taken to ensure that the standard and values of Rotary are not diluted or compromised at meetings.

Concluding remarks of PDG Dr Parmar was, "Rotary is service. You don't come to Rotary to get something out of it. You come to Rotary to put something into it. And once you've put something into it, you will get something out of it, but it won't be what you expect. It will be better."




Rtn Rambir Chauhan inducted by PDG Dr Parmar


